Three Dollar Bill Cinema fosters deeper community engagement by showcasing queer film programming, educational experiences, and social dialogue. We provide access to films by, for, and about lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and queer (LGBTQ+) people and their families, and a forum for LGBTQ+ filmmakers to share and discuss their work with audiences. We curate themed screenings throughout the year and produce programs in partnership with other arts, cultural, and service delivery organizations in the Greater Seattle area.

BASIC FUNCTION

Three Dollar Bill Cinema is seeking an organized self-starter with a passion for learning about how events, corporate partnerships, and memberships drive a non-profit organization. This person will be able to work between multiple data points, programs, and provide event support prior to and during the 27th Seattle Queer Film Festival (SQFF), October 13-23, 2022 along with other year-round events that take place during internship.

Three Dollar Bill Cinema presents this groundbreaking film festival to provide the Pacific Northwest with a venue for films by, for, and about transgender people, encouraging visibility and positive representations of transgender issues. Launched in 2006, Translations is one of only a few transgender film festivals in the world.

REEL QUEER YOUTH - August, 2022

A video production and media literacy training for LGBTQIA2+ youth and their allies ages 13-20. Use professional camera and editing equipment to express yourself in a safe, open, and fun environment with a team of professional filmmakers and mentors. Working in small groups, you will complete a short film. Cost is pay-what-you-can. Online applications open in the Spring.
